Papouch

In 2019 Papouch started the launching phase at Emmaus House. After graduating from professional trade school he was unable to find employment, so with the mentorship of our accountant and administrator, Papouch was able to start a successful business and will be living independently by March.



Kencia

After struggling for over a year looking for employment, Kencia finally found a job she loves at a local medical clinic last fall. In addition to her new position, she also started a successful clothing business. Kencia is currently saving up for her first apartment and plans on moving into independence by March.



Arianne

In December 2019 Arianne graduated from professional trade school where she studied to become an administrative assistant. She is currently finishing up her practicum and will soon be looking for full time employment as she enters the launch phase of our program.



Merly

In December 2019, Merly was part of the 1st class of Physical Therapy students to graduate from the Faculté des Sciences de Réhabilitation de Léogâne. Before graduation, she was offered a 3month contract at a hospital in Port au Prince. With the high demand for therapists in Haiti, she will be living independently soon.

The Haitian proverb, "Dèyè mòn gen mòn," (behind mountains there are mountains) accurately describes Haiti. Preserving the climb up one mountain only leads you to the summit of the next one. This is what it feels like to work in Haiti. It keeps you humble, reliant on God, and keenly aware of your powerlessness in all of it.

YEAR IN REVIEW

Resilience is the ability to keep climbing and moving forward in the midst of hardships. The staff and youth of Emmaus House did just that in 2019. The ongoing political instability of last year resulted in gas and food shortages, as well as the shutdown of schools, banks, and businesses. The powerlessness to stop it resulted in a cloud of despair across the country. We had to sit down and decide that we would keep moving forward. So the tutor still came, visitors still came, Gerome rode a bike to work, our youth started businesses, looked for employment, connected with the local church and served their community. We chose to see this time of instability as an opportunity.

Resilience cannot exist without two things: a support system and hope. I want to personally thank you for providing both to our youth last year. The only reason our youth have the ability to be resilient when many in Haiti don't is because of the prayers, hope, and support you have given them as they climb these Haitian mountains one at a time.

Cap Haitien sits at the base of the mountains. Because of you, our youth can look them straight in the eye with the confidence they need to climb them, and the mountain behind them.


